From July 23 to July 31, 2026, Yin-lam successfully completed the 9-day immersive training program and study tour in Mainland China.

Jointly organized by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department and The Chinese General Chamber of Commerce, and managed by the Hong Kong Space Museum, the Young Astronaut Training Camp aims to inspire young minds in astronomy and space technology. During the camp, Sophia traveled across Beijing, Jiuquan, and Xi'an, visiting key national aerospace facilities such as the China Astronaut Research and Training Center, the Xinglong Observatory of the National Astronomical Observatories, the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center (Dongfeng Space City), and the National Time Service Center in Xi'an.

Throughout the program, Sophia participated in hands-on simulated astronaut training and aerospace medicine orientation—including spacesuit experiences and space food tasting—and attended specialized lectures by leading aerospace scientists.
